This course is designed for those who want to expand their knowledge and understanding of drugs and alcohol issues, policies and interventions within a comparative context.

EMDAS is run jointly by four universities: Universidad Miguel Hernandez de Elche (Alicante, Spain), Aarhus University (Denmark), Middlesex University (London, UK) and Università del Piemonte Orientale (Novara, Italy).

Students will have access to a group of European teachers and other students, sharing research findings and experiences as well as personal knowledge about their own countries. They will also have the opportunity to study in partner universities or undertake placements in Europe and International Agencies, should they wish to do so.

Program and content

The course is part-time and lasts over two years. It will start in September 2017 and will end in September 2019.

The program is taught primarily through distance learning methods.

The compulsory teaching includes a first introductory module that will be taught in Alicante during an intensive one-week seminar and 4 online modules concerning theoretical aspects, policies, evidence-based Practice methods, and responses. Moreover students have to choose 3 optional modules.

Qualification

A Master certificate will be released to the students who have achieved the objectives set by each module and passed the final assessment. It will also issue the Diploma Supplement to certificate the international career of the student.
